GDPR PRIVACY NOTICE

For STAFF AND GOVERNORS

Who processes your information?

Ninestiles an Academy is the data controller of the personal information you provide to us. This means the Trust is responsible for deciding how information you provide us with, is used. We refer to your information as “personal data” and when we use your information in different ways, this is called “processing”. The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) outlines how personal data should be protected and used appropriately by organisations.

In some cases, your personal data may be shared with other people, organisations or agencies as necessary. This sharing will only occur if we have a legal obligation or duty to do so or after we have sought your permission (consent), If we share your personal data outside of school, we ensure that the same data protection standards are upheld by other people involved in processing your personal data.

The categories of staff information that we process include:

- personal identifiers and contacts (such as name, employee number, national insurance number, contact details and address)
- characteristics (such as ethnicity, gender, age)
- safeguarding information (such as DBS)
- relevant medical information (such as Doctors details, medical conditions, allergies)
- work absence information (such as number of absences and reasons)
- qualifications (and where relevant, subjects taught)
- payroll information (such as salary, bank details, position, start date)

Why do we collect and use your information?

Ninestiles an Academy hold personal data relating to employees, governors and others. We may also receive information from previous employers, Local Authority and/or the DfE. We may share personal data with other agencies as necessary under our legal obligations or otherwise in accordance with our duties as a Trust.

We will use your personal information for the following:

- for the recruitment process and for carrying out pre-employment checks;
- for safeguarding students;
- for checking your identity and right to work in UK;
- for checking your qualifications;
- to keep an audit trail of the checks we have made and our relationship with you in case of employment claims;
- to set up payroll and pension and to reimburse expenses;
- for dealing with HMRC;
- for communicating with you, including for marketing purposes;
- for carrying out our role as your employer or potential employer.

We use workforce data to:

- a) enable the development of a comprehensive picture of the workforce and how it is deployed
- b) inform the development of recruitment and retention policies
- c) enable individuals to be paid

We collect and use personal data in order to meet our legal requirements and legitimate interests set out in the GDPR and UK law, including those in relation to the following:

- Article 6 and Article 9 of the GDPR
- Education Act 1996

Whilst the majority of the personal data you provide is mandatory, some is provided on a voluntary basis, you will be informed whether you are required to provide this data or if it is requested on a voluntary basis.

How long is your data stored for?

Your personal data will be held securely in line with Trust's GDPR policy and IRMS guide lines. (www.irms.org.uk).

In accordance with GDPR, the school does not store personal data indefinitely; data is only stored for as long as is necessary to complete the task for which it was originally collected.

Who we share workforce information with?

The Trust will routinely share information with:

- The Department for Education
- Local Authorities and its agencies
- Other Government agencies
- Payroll providers
- National Health Service
- Occupational Health

Why we share school workforce information

We are required to share information about our school employees with the (DfE) under section 5 of the Education (Supply of Information about the School Workforce) (England) Regulations 2007 and amendments.

All data is transferred securely and held by DfE under a combination of software and hardware controls which meet the current [government security policy framework](#).

How Government uses your data

The workforce data that we lawfully share with the DfE through data collections:

- informs departmental policy on pay and the monitoring of the effectiveness and diversity of the school workforce
- links to school funding and expenditure
- supports 'longer term' research and monitoring of educational policy

Sharing by the Department

The Department may share information about school employees with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children or the effective deployment of school staff in England by:

- conducting research or analysis
- producing statistics
- providing information, advice or guidance

The Department has robust processes in place to ensure that the confidentiality of personal data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access to it and its use. Decisions on whether DfE releases personal data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data
- the purpose for which it is required
- the level and sensitivity of data requested; and
- the arrangements in place to securely store and handle the data

To be granted access to school workforce information, organisations must comply with its strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

What are your rights?

Under data protection legislation, you have the right to request access to information about you that we hold. You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress

- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- a right to seek redress, either through the ICO, or through the courts

Where the processing of your data is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time.
