Dear Parents,

A warm welcome back and what a fabulous start to the term! The children look fantastic in their uniform. Their footwear is smart and compliant with school's new expectations. Rebadging of uniform will be phased-in, but the earliest new logo jumpers will be available will be close to the end of this full term.

We have a new staff and you will need to get to know them. They have had photographs taken, and we are creating a website page with them on this term. Teachers and teaching assistants will be on the doors at the end of each day and this will be your time to talk to them. As I said in the last newsletter (see website), we will be arranging times (after school) for you to 'meet the teacher' from week beginning Monday 18<sup>th</sup> of September. Our staff have to abide by a Code of Conduct. Our pupils have a behaviour policy to follow and a 'Class Charter' they have made that follows the UN CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD (included in this pack). We also have expectations on you as parents or visitors to the school. They are included in today's pack. On Friday, there will be a HOME/ SCHOOL AGREEMENT for you to sign, but first you needed details of the expectations. Do let us know what you think of them. They are common to most Birmingham schools.

As you may know, Ninestiles Academy Trust and Pegasus Primary School have 'rebooted'. We are placing the outcomes for your children at the heart of what we do. There are extremely high expectations in all areas of school life – from how children walk around in corridors (silently), to them completing their homework and continuing learning beyond our walls. Get them reading, get them learning those spellings and times tables, find out new and interesting information with them.

We want our pupils to be happy, brave, curious and inspired. This term, we want to build their RESILIENCE. Ask your children what RESILIENCE means. RESILIENCE is one of the last things they heard about at school today. Have they been listening? Have they been thinking?
