They will need to be back in school ready to share with Parents on Wednesday 12th December at 2:30pm.

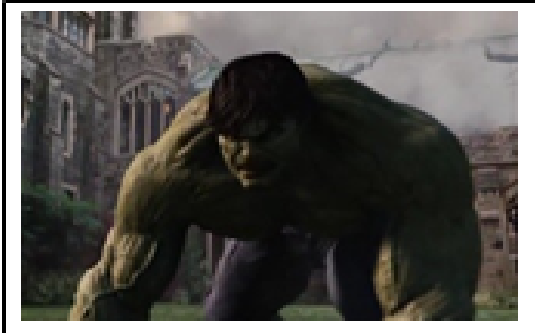

## University of Devastation!
