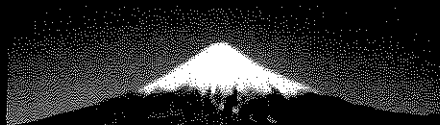

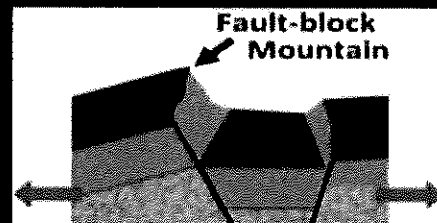
## Topic - Misty Mountain Sierra

Our topic is all about mountains - what they are, which ranges they are part of and how they are formed. Find out about each of the mountain type below. How many different mountains can you find for each type?

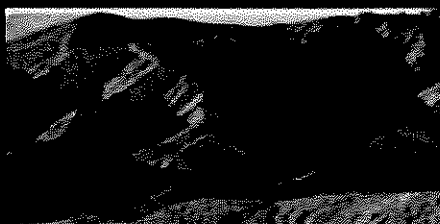

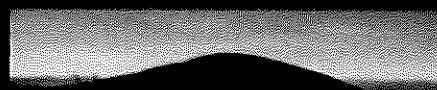
